<u>Dinghies</u> So much has happened that it is difficult to know where to start – how about the beginning? The NYC Dinghy Regatta, held in May, saw a total of 16 boats on the water, with visitors coming from as far afield as the Solent. After some close and exciting racing, including a novel long distance trip to Benton Castle, the winner of Division 1, Jenny (Hayling Island YC), said how enjoyable and friendly sailing at Neyland was!





Regular weekday racing has been held on Tuesdays this year and congratulations must go to Laser sailor Eloise for winning her first Div 1 trophy in the Spring Series and to Nina for first place in Div 2. An honourable mention to novice sailor Elliott Underwood (32) for third place in his first season. As he said, "with a safety boat there to look after me and tell me what to do, what did I have to worry about?" The Summer Series is now drawing to a close with a tight finish expected between Eloise and John Thompson in his of both Flying 15. Meanwhile, NYC has been represented by our young Laser sailors at the ILCA National regatta. Eloise finished 23rd in the ILCA4 Silver Fleet and Finn came 42nd in the ILCA 7s. The local Tera sailors went en masse to the National and World competitions. Nina came 10th in the Nationals and 17th in the Worlds and only narrowly missed being in the top three girls. And, well done to Sirene who was first placed girl in the RS Tera Sport fleet at the Eric Twiname Championships held this year on Rutland Water. <u>Cruisers</u> The larger boats have been enjoying the longer summer evenings since April in their Wednesday racing. In the Spring Series, Richard Incledon and his crew on Fourplay regularly saw off the opposition to win Division 1 with six 1sts and a 2nd place. Over the summer John Nutting's Jaloha, helmed by Paul Harries, has been enjoying more success and has tied with Fourplay on points at the top of the table. In Division 2, Sea Otter, helmed by Dave Goodman was almost as unbeatable in the Spring, scoring four 1sts and three 2nds. In the Summer Series it has been a different story, with Paul Rendall's Placebo and Luke Howell's Chiron battling each other at the front of the fleet.

Neyland Cruiser Week, held at the end of June, saw 7 boats fighting for the honours, with different boats winning each of the four races. A special mention must go to Grey Knight carrying Rod Kirk, supported by his friends and family, for their 1st place in Race 3 as part of their preparations before heading off to sail in the Cork Week regatta. The recent Bank Holiday NYC Cruiser Regatta was also well supported with a total of 11 boats in the two divisions. Enormous thanks are due to the generous local companies who donated prizes for this event: Dale Sailing, Audrey Johns, The Alumchine, Castle Printwear and Ratseys.
